History

- Started in 1986/7 after a trip to New Zealand
- Stock from wild capture in Newtonmore
- Set up of various initiatives and marketing schemes
- Subsequent demise of schemes due to the difficulty of finding suitable abattoirs
- Last 12 years our deer enterprise has operated as a park selling culled stock to game dealers.
- 60 breeding hinds, 2 to 3 mature stags, average 55 calves/year
- 60 acres in fence, set over 4 fields.


2011 to today (The current scene)

- 2011 Construction of new farmhouse and farmyard. Better security for deer fields.
- New shed designed as GP building with allocated space for chill and handling.
- 2013 I take over the day to day running of the farm.
- Deer conference 4th September 2013 kicks off investment by Scottish Government for Deer Demonstration Day Project starting in 2014

- Attendance at the Deer demonstration project provides introduction to Scottish Venison Partnership
- Employ Alan's services to reconfigure farm.
- Start the move from park system to farm system.
- Winter 2014 / 2015 construct new handling system internally and externally

2011 to today (The current scene)

- 2015 renew fencing and install raceways, reconfigure fields.
- Employ Jonathan Holmes as agronomist, sample and treat fields summer 2015 – ongoing project.
- Overwintering of calves in farm building.

- 140 hinds of mixed age
- 40 yearling hinds
- 3 stags
- approx. 100 calves.
- 36 yearling stags –
 batches of 6 to 8
 transported to
 Downfield each
 Monday. (20
 remaining)





The future

- Carry on with upkeep of fences.
- Purchase / construction of new deer crush.
- Install approx. 1.6km of new fencing to take in 2 new fields additional 26 acres. Capacity up to approx. 200 hinds.

Additional Fields



The future

- Investigate grazing of winter crops.
- Renew grass and stich in new grass species to improve grazing and silage production.
- Install approx. 1.8km of new fencing on a second site to take in 3 fields totaling 60 acres. Additional capacity of approx. 150 hinds.
- New farm building for overwintering of stock. 300 calves!
